### ***Rector's Message***

Happy New Year! I hope this newsletter finds you all well, and I hope that you all had a very merry Christmas.

For many people, with the New Year comes new resolutions; to be healthier, to be nicer, to be more fiscally responsible, etc. As the corporate body of Christ, churches are really not all that different. All could resolve to be physically healthier in terms of the church building, and spiritually healthier in terms of the congregation. They could resolve to be nicer, meaning taking steps to create a more welcoming atmosphere or doing more in terms of outreach to the community in which they reside. And of course, fiscal responsibility is something that is usually at the forefront as stewardship of our ministry is a continual discipline. It's all part of being Christ's heart and hands in the world.

Early in the fall, I drew a poor excuse for a target on a poster board and asked you to write hopes or goals for Grace on sticky notes and post them on the target. I was able to group them into four main themes and now have them posted on my office wall between the clock and the light switch so that they are the first thing I see when I come in, and the last thing I see on my way out each day. The four groups were Christian Formation, Outreach, Revenue, and the Kitchen, to which I will add the Church Building as a whole. I would like to speak to each of these just a bit.

Christian Formation is up and running in various incarnations. Not limited to the class sessions after the service on Sundays, we now offer Bible studies on the first and third Fridays of each month. We have also added supplemental worship experiences with the Wednesday evening Enriching Our Worship service and the Evensong and Taizé services. In the coming year, I hope to improve upon the after-service class sessions, particularly with my own preparation. As always, I welcome any suggested topics of interest and curiosity you may have. I would also like to continue with more special liturgical offerings. As Episcopalians, there are many beautiful ways in which we gather together in prayer and worship, and I would love to try them all.

Little by little I am gaining increased involvement with other area clergy and groups like FACC. If there is one thing that my Leadership Institute course at Highland has taught me, there is no shortage of need in Freeport and there are a number of non-profit groups like RAMP, Voices, or Contact that could really benefit from our support. Outreach does not require us to reinvent the wheel, unless of course there is a ministry we feel passionate about that no one has tried before. Through continued networking and increased visibility, there is no reason Grace Church cannot “get in the game” in a big way in serving our community.

Revenue presents some interesting, though not insurmountable challenges. It is also not unrelated to the building as a whole. Some creativity will be required in both of these areas moving forward. Once the kitchen project is completed, we will be able to host food related fundraisers. We also have a tremendous amount of unused space. I have asked the vestry, and now I extend the invitation to everyone, to begin thinking about how we can utilize our space better. As someone new to the building with an outsider’s perspective, I see many rooms closed off as a memorial to the past that have also been recommissioned as storage with no particular order.

Moving forward, I would like us to get creative with what to do with our abundance of space, and I cannot do that alone. Originally designed as a youth center, we have to confront the reality that we do not have youth in the same way as before. Don't worry. It's not significant to Grace or even the Episcopal Church. But can we re-envision this space? Might there be other ways to still devote it to youth-oriented programs in the community, like art, music, or dance classes? I understand a daycare had been in the nursery space at one point, but that ended up not being a long-term scenario. That's fine. What's next?

While we brainstorm and keep an ear open to the community's needs, we cannot offer a space that is not ready. Much of the space, particularly on the third floor, needs some TLC before we can consider trying to utilize it. Nothing major or costly. Just some paint, time, and a little rearranging. Maybe we can invite some local artists, or those kids who did the murals downtown to add a little color to the mix. I don't know, but we have some good energy going. The Holy Spirit is definitely at work at Grace. In the coming year, let us engage in prayerful discernment and dare to dream a little.

April has many important dates, apart from Easter - Earth Day, Arbor Day, Faith Climate Action Week - more on this later

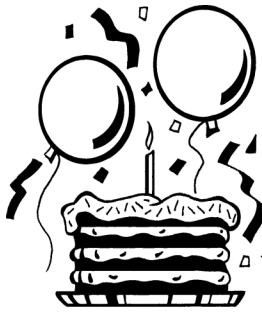

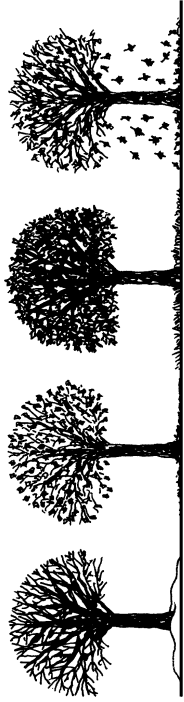
