Rector's Message

After last month's newsletter, I learned two important lessons: Do not comment on the weather, and my desk must not be made of real wood. You might recall I wrote prematurely about being safe from snowstorms and then knocked on my desk in the hopes that I would not be eating my words. The day the newsletter arrived in the mail, it snowed about five inches . . . in May. Well played Mother Nature. Well played.

I will not hazard a guess, then, as to what June will bring weather-wise, but I will say there is much for us to be excited about on Grace's calendar.

First and foremost, we will celebrate The Day of Pentecost on Sunday, June 9th, commemorating that moment recorded in Acts when the promised gift of the Holy Spirit arrives, descending upon the disciples with a violent wind and tongues of fire. This is one of the seven Principal Feasts on our Church calendar, and it is often referred to as the birthday of the Church. In light of that, you are welcome to bring Grace a gift on that day. Andrea Mysen as facilitator. It was a very positive experience as we identified our strengths as a church along with some of our goals and wishes for the future. The vestry also selected two members as their representatives for the upcoming meeting with Rev. Andrea Mysen, John Gush and Glenn Gungel. After a lunch break, we held the regular vestry meeting for May.

The wardens, the two Vestry representatives and Father Brian will be meeting with Rev. Andrea Mysen of the Chicago diocese on Tuesday, June 11, to complete the next step in the mutual ministry review. We're excited as we move forward in this process.

The landscaping project has been completed and we hope you're all pleased with the results. It should be very beautiful as the plants mature. We'll be asking for volunteers to help with some light maintenance over the summer and fall to keep things looking good, so if you enjoy gardening, please consider this.

Eagle Point Solar (based in Dubuque) will be conducting a site assessment to determine the feasibility of installing solar panels for the church. Thoughts for Father's Day


An unknown father who began to consider the example he should set for his children penned the following poem:
