# Rector's Corner

A couple of Sundays ago, during announcements, I mentioned wanting to try resolving two issues with one maneuver: lack of coffee hour hosts and lack of Christian formation.

Coffee hour has, at least in my time here, been a difficult ministry to fulfill. Volunteer hosts graciously donate time and money to provide food; the Church provides coffee, tea, and their various additives; and folks kick in a couple bucks as the Spirit moves them, which goes toward the purchase of more coffee, cream, sugar, and other necessities. It is a model that asks a lot of those who volunteer to host, and it is a model I have offered a few times to help reimagine in order to ease the burden and entice more participants, but to no avail.

For a while now, there have been many Sundays that have gone unfilled on the signup sheet, only to be picked up at the last minute by the same folks that already host a lot. Part of the reason is simply that our pool of volunteers has shrunk. The rest I can only speculate – time, money, apprehension about the new dishwasher, do not know what to serve? My field education parish was large, and one Sunday there might be a tin of sugar cookies that are only a smidge softer than hardtack (I know, I have eaten hardtack), and then the next Sunday there might be the youth group putting on a full taco bar to make all of Texas proud. The point is, it can be as simple or elaborate as the host desires, and the rest of us will rejoice and be glad in it regardless. The other issue is a lack of Christian formation, which is far more concerning to me since it is part of a priest's vocation in accordance with the Canons to provide religious instruction. Time is always the major issue, though. There is never a time that is going to work for everyone, but we have done Friday morning Bible studies, Thursday morning theology studies, evening spirituality studies on Zoom, and some variety of each after church, all of which have fallen flat. Then again, I suppose it could be me and, like Taylor Swift, I'm the problem. However, whenever I do a survey of the congregation, one of the things that consistently comes up is the desire for Christian formation.

People work during the day, do not like to drive at night, come from far away, or just want to enjoy the casual fellowship of coffee hour, all of which is understandable. Sunday is the one day we are all here. So here is what I am proposing: On October 8<sup>th</sup>, and all subsequent Second Sundays of the month, I will host Christian formation in the former youth room in lieu of coffee hour. There will still be coffee to drink, and those just wanting to converse over a cup are welcome to do so in St. Stephen's Hall. But, for those who wish to participate in Christian formation, we will meet down the hall in the All Purpose Room, or Room of Requirement.

The idea for this came one Sunday when no one had signed up to host coffee hour. I got downstairs after hanging up my vestments and everyone had already left. Now, coffee hour has always been presented to me as a reason why we cannot have Christian formation after Church, so the thought was, what if there is no coffee hour? Just one Sunday a month. There would be nothing to impede a gathering for educational pursuits, which could still include coffee, of course, and there would be one less Sunday to worry about having coffee hour coverage.

I hope you are amenable to trying this for a few months, and then, after the New Year, we can evaluate and adjust as needed. I look forward to being in fellowship and formation (and coffee) with you this fall on the second Sunday of each month.


