Rector's Message

Happy New Year!

Perhaps it is a mechanism for coping with stress, but it seems like every year around the Church's busiest times – Christmas, Holy Week, Easter – I develop an amnesia that allows me to believe the frenzied pace that surrounds these festive observances will be followed by a period of calm. I suppose, relatively speaking, this is true after the special services have passed and we return to our regular schedule. But, peering ahead on my calendar, there is still plenty to look forward to in the coming weeks, with two items I would like to draw your attention to now.

First, on Sunday, January 14th, we have our next formation gathering after the service. We have had a few such gatherings under this new Second Sunday format, and I have found them enjoyable thus far. I only hope they are as enjoyable for those who attend as they are for me. I did ask if anyone has specific topics that they want to discuss or learn more about to please write them down on the small whiteboard just inside the Room of Requirement (former youth room) where we meet. Lo, someone snuck in and wrote down two great topics, which I am looking forward to:

We will start with *forgiveness*, not only because it was listed first, but also because it is a very appropriate subject for consideration just a month before we begin the Lenten season (Feb. 14th) and our reflection on sin, penitence, and the forgiveness of our sins through Jesus Christ.

Forgiveness was the theme of the Preaching Excellence Program the year I attended in 2017. Our keynote presenter at the conference that year was Dr. Everett Worthington, Jr., a psychologist who specializes in the study of forgiveness and reconciliation, so I came home with some good resources to support our conversation, which could necessitate two sessions, depending on the depth of our exploration of our capacity for forgiveness and God's.

Also in January is our parish Annual Meeting – January 28th to be exact – where you, the parishioners of Grace Church, view the finalized budget, select your lay leaders, and set goals for 2024. So, I will now make my annual appeal for new Vestry members. Our senior warden, Katie Shore, and Marissa Routson will be rotating off, leaving two vacancies. I have a verbal commitment for one, so we would perhaps only need one more "communicant in good standing," as the Canons specify, to step up and be on the Vestry. The meetings are every third Sunday of the month after the service, and they last approximately 90 minutes.

Vestry often gets a bad rap based on past rectors or experiences concerning contentious issues in the church. In my time as your rector, the mood of the meetings has been pleasant, there has been little to no discord on issues, and I try my very best to keep meetings flowing while informative. I will attribute part of this to the fact that my own goals as your rector are pretty simple: keep Grace Church open, spiritually nourishing, and engaged in the community; maintain the structural integrity and functionality our 137-year-old building; and make space for creative and edifying ways to achieve all of the above...oh, and all while trying to stay within budget. If you are interested in sharing your talents towards these goals, please let me know.

I look forward to what the next year has in store for Grace Church, and as always, I look forward to being in worship and fellowship with you.

Treasurer's Report


Below is an analysis comparing the actual results for the 11 months of this year to the annual budget.


