Rector's Corner

Several years ago (pre-pandemic), I attended a workshop at our Diocesan Convention that was an introduction to the College of Congregational Development, a weeklong intensive offered by the diocese to teach skills for building healthy, vital congregations.

Part of the presentation focused on Church Size Theory, which, depending on what resource you consult, is a taxonomy for churches based on several factors like average Sunday attendance (ASA), church governance, the role of clergy within the parish, group dynamics, and even the characteristics behind church disputes (something the chart simply calls "fights"). For example, a Family size parish has an ASA of under 75, is group-centered, governed by key family or families, where the pastor is essentially a chaplain, and fights are family feuds. The next largest is Pastoral size, followed by Transitional size, then Program size, and finally Resource size, which would be the experience of my friend, Spencer, who serves as one of the clergy staff at the National Cathedral in Washington D.C.

Generally speaking, Grace Church fits within the parameters of a Family size parish, which makes up about 47% of all Episcopal parishes. Obviously, some of the factors might not precisely correspond with Grace Church, and there may be some overlap with the other size categories. One such overlap that has me particularly excited is a characteristic of larger churches having new groups forming and programs offered.

So, I thought it behooved me to create and share with you a program schedule for Grace, which goes into effect this month, so that everyone is aware who is in the building when, where, and why. It was an educational experience playing air traffic controller from New York while I was on vacation so our groups and Mac Camp did not conflict with one another, but having a stated calendar will hopefully make life easier on everybody. Without further ado, it is my pleasure to share with you Grace Episcopal Church's program schedule:

- Choir meets Wednesdays, 6:00 p.m. in St. Stephen's Hall.
- ECW meets 1st Friday of each month, 11:30 a.m. in St. Stephen's Hall, BYO Lunch.
- Love Hopes Grief Group meets 1st and 3rd Wednesdays of each month, 6:30-8:00 p.m. in the Guild Room. This is a closed group for parents who have lost children.
- Family Success Program (Hope WINS) meets 3rd Thursday of each month, 5:00-7:00 p.m., location TBD. This is an education and coaching program for parents.
- Family Support Group meets the last Tuesday of each month, 6:30 p.m. in the All-Purpose room (former youth room). Run by Janelle Nelson, this is a support group for parents, particularly of special needs children, but it is Open to anyone. Hope WINS provides childcare.

Mac Camp will also be hosting a handful of day camps throughout the semester – basically scheduled days off from school – as well as mini camps during winter and spring breaks. I will post this schedule on the bulletin board outside the kitchen.

It is an exciting time for Grace Church as we are starting to bear good fruit. May this fruit continue to flourish, and may the Holy Spirit continue the thrive at Grace Church.

Peace, Fr. Brian <u>CROP Walk</u> will be held on <u>Sunday, October 6th</u>. Teams will begin gathering at 1:00 p.m. at Debate Square, and the walk will commence at 1:30 p.m. There is a one-mile, two-mile, and four-mile route from which walkers can choose. 
