Rector's Message

Greetings and blessings to you all this season of Advent!
Over ten years ago, Ellen, baby Lucy, and I went to stay
with my aunt and uncle in Newtown, CT, while we visited Berkely
Divinity School at Yale as a possibility for my seminary education.
On the ride to Yale, my aunt said that one of the most
unexpected things she missed about the Midwest after moving
there was the "courtesy merge" – as you proceed along an
on-ramp, those already cruising along the highway instinctively
change lanes to allow you to merge onto the highway safely. Or,
with roles reversed, you are that person who kindly scooches
over.

Not so on the East Coast, apparently.

I have had one other occasion to be out that way, and sure enough, my driver, who seemed like a kind and ordinary individual, became a force to be reckoned with on the highway. Slow down, speed up, whatever, just get the hell out of the way. I had no idea until then how much the courtesy merge figured into my overall faith in humanity.

This year's Living Compass Advent devotional focuses on generosity, and it is around this time of year that we begin to see an uptick in appeals for our generosity from this organization or that. It is a good thing, ultimately (though eliminating need altogether would be better), to support endeavors to make as joyous a holiday season as possible for those in need. Between

Grace Church and my personal mailbox, I get dozens of mailers asking for monetary support, mostly, and it can be a little daunting. Who do you help when there is so much need?

Monetary and material giving – like toys at Christmas, winter coat drives, or food for a local pantry – are terrific ways to put our faith into action. Presently I am reading the Letter of James, who makes the argument that faith AND works are essential to Christian living: "For just as the body without the spirit is dead, so faith without works is also dead."

Each of us lives out our faith through generosity in different ways. But there something elemental in our Christian living that goes beyond simply mailing a check off to a particular ministry, or dropping toys in a Salvation Army barrel, as important as that is (please do that). It is a *generosity of spirit* that comes from our oneness in Christ and compels us to show empathy, exercise compassion, and, yes, even offer generously from our own material resources. In Christ, we have been commanded to share the Holy Spirit (a spirit of generosity in itself) with others by loving them as Christ loves us. It is this spirit that informs our way of being, that provides the foundation underlying something even as seemingly trivial as the courtesy merge.

As we move through this season of holy anticipation, awaiting the coming of God's incarnate Word, Jesus Christ, I invite you to meditate on *generosity*. In what ways can you show generosity of spirit, not just through charitable giving, but by putting forth Christ's spirit of love in your daily life and work? In what ways can you bring kindness, cheer, patience, and hope to others? How can you signal to your fellow travelers it is safe to merge and join you on the journey?

I wish you all a prayerful and spiritually nourishing Advent as we wait for our Immanuel.

Treasurer Report

Below is an analysis comparing the actual results for the first 10 months of this year to the annual budget. At this time in the year we expect our revenue and expenses to be around 83% of the total amounts budgeted.

The annual budget anticipates a deficit for the year of \$17,712. At the end of October we have an excess of revenue over expenses of \$13,728. This is misleading because we have a couple of large expenses to pay in November and December. One of which is Property and Liability insurance which will be about \$14,000. Also, we have already received a large portion of our pledges in the first 10 months so our income will decline. Be assured that we will have a deficit at the end of the year as anticipated by the budget. Please call me if you have any questions.
